

Hereford Cattle

Bulls are usually docile and easy to handle

Their popularity is shown by their continued use as a beef-producing animal that crosses well with other breeds

Was developed in Herefordshire, England

Herefords can be either horned or polled, have a reddish-brown colour with their white faces being their dominant characteristic



Among beef breeds, they are not high milk producers but have good growth potential and calve relatively easily

Hereford cattle are extremely hardy and show excellent foraging ability

One of the oldest cattle breeds, was first imported into Canada in 1860
